## Understanding your ALABAMA LANDSCAPE MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Alabama Landscape Management Plan provides you with information concerning sustainable forestry practices, including (but not limited to):

- Forest Health
- Wildlife Management
- Best Management Practices For Water Quality
- Protection Of Special Sites
- Protection Of Threatened And Endangered Species
- Recognition And Control Of
  Invasive Species
- Ecosystems
- Silvicultural Practices
- Forest Certification Standards And Requirements



There are 2 parts to your Alabama Landscape Management Plan: the Physical (documents you receive from your forester that are tailored to your specific stands according to your objectives) and Virtual (these additional elements include web-based information, publications and resource material). Both of these contain several elements to help you reach your goals!

### Your forester will work with you to prepare a map delineating your forest stands according to their forest type and your objectives.

These come from discussions with your forester.

#### **Stand Management Recommendations**

A document providing stand history and recommendations according to your objectives.

#### **Management Journal**

**Stand Management Map** 

A document that you or your forester can update as needed such as if your objectives change for a stand. This can help keep your plan updated and adaptable.
